

## Reasons

- The proposed development would materially contravene paragraph 2.3.6.(i) and (ii) of the Dublin County Development Plan 1993 regarding the development of dwellings in areas located within agricultural zones in that the proposed location of the residence and medical practice is in a rural area on a substandard rural road and it is not established in the submission that the applicant has a 'genuine need' to reside within an agricultural zone.
- The submitted details are insufficient and trial hole test results do not indicate that the proposed septic tank arrangements and percolation areas satisfy the requirements set out in SR 6 1991. As a result the proposed development would be prejudicial to public health.
- The proposed development would generate significant additional traffic and pedestrian movements at the access to the site which is outside speed limits, and as a result the proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard.
- The proposed development constitutes undesirable ribbon development on a substandard rural road network, which would lead to a demand for uneconomic provision of services and would set an undesirable precedent for further similar development in the area.
