1. The introduction of gaming machines into the premises would be at variance with the existing use of the premises as a leisure centre and could be seriously injurious to the amenities of property in the vicinity.
2. The proposed development would materially contravene Condition 2 of An Bord Pleanala's decision to grant permission for an extension to the existing leisure centre (YA 290). This condition states:-
"The premises shall be closed to the public between the hours of 11.00 p.m. and 9.30 a.m. and no gaming machines requiring a license under the Gaming and Lotteries Act, 1956 shall be installed or operated on the premises."
and it would materially contravene Condition 1 of An Bord Pleanala's decision to grant permission for the continuance of use of the premises as a funfair and amusement arcade (XA 357). This condition states:-
"The premises shall be closed to the public between the hours of 11.00 p.m. and 9.30 a.m. and no gaming machines shall be installed or operated on the premises."

(2) A party to an appeal making a request to An Bord Pleanala for an oral Hearing of an appeal must, in addition to (1) above, pay to An Bord Pleanala a fee of £30 (Thirty Pounds). (3) A person who is not a party to an appeal must pay a fee of £10 (Ten Pounds) to An Bord Pleanala in relation to an appeal. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn, An Bord Pleanala will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to them in the first instance.



APPEAL by Joe Aprile of 1B Castle Crescent, Monastery Road, Clondalkin, County Dublin, against the decision made on the 22nd day of March, 1984, by the Council of the County of Dublin, to refuse permission for the provision of four gaming machines in an amusement arcade at 1B Castle Crescent, Monastery Road, Clondalkin, County Dublin.

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 to 1983, permission is hereby refused for the provision of the said gaming machines for the reasons set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

1. The introduction of gaming machines into the premises would be at variance with the existing use of the premises as a leisure centre and would be seriously injurious to the amenities of property in the vicinity.
2. The proposed development would materially contravene conditions attached to decisions made by an Bord Pleanála under references PL 6/5/59284 and PL 6/5/63382 granting permission for the retention of a fun fair and amusement arcade and the extension to the amusement arcade in the premises, which required that no gaming machines requiring a license under the Gaming and Lotteries Act, 1956, should be installed or operated on the premises. The Board is still of the opinion that the terms of these conditions are reasonable.
