

## Reasons

The proposed development involves the construction of apartments and represents an intensification of use on the site which will in turn lead to high rates of foul effluent discharge. The existing foul sewer network in Newcastle is under capacity and suffers surface water infiltration furing periods of rainfall. The network will require extensive renovation/augmentation to cater for additional development in the village.

Development of the kind would be premature pending the completion of the Saggart-Rathcoole-Newcastle Drainage Scheme. Therefore, the proposed development is contrary to the proper planning and development of the area and would be prejudicial to public health.
