APPEAL by Sharlyac Limited of 23 Herbert Place, Dublin against the decision made on the 4th day of March, 1983, by the Council of the County of Dublin to refuse permission for warehouse/light industrial development on a site at Corbally, Tallaght, County Dublin:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 to 1983, permission is hereby refused for the said warehouse/light industrial development for the reasons set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

1. The site is located in an area where the objective of the planning authority, as expressed in the Dublin County Development Plan, is to protect and provide for the development of agriculture. This objective is considered reasonable and the proposed development would conflict with it and would be seriously injurious to the amenities of the area.
2. The proposed development, based on a more intense and varied industrial use of the site, would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard as it would generate additional turning movements on a heavily trafficked National Secondary Route where the maximum speed limit applies.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Acts the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order, P/ **A/437/83** dated **4/3/83** decide to refuse:

For **Proposed warehouse/light industrial development at Corbally, Tallaght.**

- for the following reasons:
1. The proposed development which envisages the construction of a number of separate light industrial/warehouse units would contravene materially, the permission granted on appeal by the Minister of Local Government by Order PL6/5/25343 dated 14/6/74, for a warehouse extension to an existing factory on this site to be used for the storage and servicing of mobile machinery and earth moving machinery ~~and earth moving machinery and~~ <sup>and</sup> ~~which~~ would not be in the interests of the proper planning and development of the area.
  2. Public piped water supply or sewerage facilities are not available to serve the proposed development.
  3. The proposed development is premature by reason of the said existing deficiency in the provision of public piped services and the ~~xxx~~ period within which such deficiency may reasonably be expected to be made good.
  4. The applicants have not submitted plans to provide for alternative foul and surface water drainage and water supply arrangements to serve the proposed development.
  5. The proposed development would lead to a significantly more intensive use of the site <sup>than</sup> ~~that~~ originally approved under the Ministerial appeal decision of 14/6/74. This intensification of activity would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard due to the anticipated increase in vehicular turning movements onto the heavily trafficked Blessing Road, National Secondary Route.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to An Bord Pleanala by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and should be addressed to An Bord Pleanala, Irish Life Centre, Dublin 1, and accompanied by a deposit of £10. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn, An Bord Pleanala will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to them in the first instance.
