Reasons

- The submitted details do not satisfy the requirements of the Local Government (Planning and Development) Regulations, 1994, as no elevations or plans of the structures proposed for retention are submitted.
- The portion of the site on which the containers are located is within an area which is zoned G in the South Dublin County Development Plan 1998, the objective of which is "To protect and improve High Amenity Areas". It is the policy of the Planning Authority, as set out in Development Plan policy H17 to conserve the existing character of the High Amenity zone. Within the High Amenity zone, use for industrial purposes is not normally permitted. The development proposed for retention is not in accordance with policy H17 or with the zoning objective for the area and would therefore contravene materially the zoning objective for the area.
- 3 The proposed development for the retention of unsightly steel containers, by reason of the site's location within the Liffey Valley Special Amenity Area, would be contrary to the policies of the Council regarding proposed development within the Liffey Valley Special Amenity Area as set out in policy H21 and Appendix E of the South Dublin County Development Plan, 1998, and would be likely to prejudice the achievement of the objectives of the Order. The development proposed for retention does not therefore conform with the proper planning and development of the area.
