APPEAL by A. Hanlon care of Joseph and Company Design Group Limited of Ballybride Road, Shankill, County Dublin, against the decision made on the 6th day of July, 1973, by the Council of the County of Dublin, deciding to refuse to grant an outline permission for the erection of a house on a site at Blessington Road, Brittas Little, with a direct access to the main Tallaght/Blessington Road:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, outline permission is hereby refused for the erection of the said house for the reason set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

The proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard due to the generation of additional vehicular turning movements on the Tallaght/Blessington national secondary road (N 81) at a point where the maximum speed-limit applies.


In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order **P/2623/78** dated **5th July, 1978** decide to refuse:

1. The proposed development would contravene materially condition (1) of the grant of outline permission on appeal by the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Local Government dated 27th October, 1971.
2. The proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard due to the generation of additional vehicular turning movements on the Tallaght/Blessington National secondary road at a point where the maximum speed limit applies.

When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
