APPEAL by Liam McNamara, of 25 Alden Road, Dublin against the decision made on the 18th day of January, 1979, by the Council of the County of Dublin deciding to refuse to grant a permission for the erection of a house at Blackhills Road, Barnageeragh, Skerries:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, permission is hereby refused for the erection of the said house for the reasons set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

1. It is an objective of the planning authority, as expressed in the County Development Plan, to reserve the area in which the site is located to provide for the further development of agriculture. This objective is considered reasonable and the proposed development would be in conflict with it.
2. The additional traffic movements generated by the proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard because the site is served by a rural road which is substandard in width and alignment.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Acts the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order, P/ **253/79** dated **18th January, 1979.** decide to refuse:

For **proposed dwelling at Blackhills Road, Barnageeragh, Skerries.**

for the following reasons:

1. The site is located in an area of prime agricultural land, zoned in the County Development Plan with the objective of providing for the further development of agriculture. This proposal would be in conflict with that objective and so contrary to the proper planning and development of the area.

This type of development (tandon development) in rural areas is undesirable, as could set a precedent for similar developments in the area.

The proposed development is served by a narrow country road, sub-standard in width and alignment, and would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard.
