APPEAL by John Sisk and Son (Dublin) Limited, of Wilton Works, Naas Road, Dublin, against the decision made on the 2nd day of June, 1977, by the Council of the County of Dublin deciding to refuse to grant a permission for the retention of an access road to Greenhills Industrial Estate at Greenhills Road, Tallaght, in accordance with plans and particulars lodged with the said Council:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, it is hereby decided, for the reasons set out in the Schedule hereto, to grant permission for the retention of the said access road in accordance with the said plans and particulars and the said permission is hereby granted.

APPLICANT: J. Sisk & Son (Dublin) Ltd.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/1812/77 dated 2nd June, 1977. decide to refuse:

~~OUTLINE PERMISSION~~ PERMISSION; ~~APPROVAL~~

for Proposed access road at Greenhills Road, Tallaght.

for the following reasons:

1. The retention of this access would contravene materially a condition attached to an existing permission, i.e., Condition No. 2, of decision to grant permission by Order No: P/3484/73 dated 23/11/73, viz; that the temporary access be removed on or before 31/12/75.
2. The retention of this access approximately 50-metres from a proposed new access road at the west side of Greenhills Road which will serve the Tallaght Industrial Estate would lower the level of service onto the existing Greenhills Road and would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard because of the unacceptable generation of heavy traffic turning movements to and from Greenhills Road.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and should be addressed to the Secretary, (Planning Appeals Section), Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
