A PERMISSION/APP~~ROVAL~~ has been granted for the development described below subject to the undermentioned conditions.

Proposed retention of alterations to refiner groundwood plant at Clondalkin for Clondalkin Paper Mills.

## Conditions

1. Subject to the conditions of this permission, the development to be carried out and completed strictly in accordance with the plans and specification lodged with the application.
2. That the requirements of the Building Bye-laws section to be adhered to in this development.
3. That the requirements of the Sanitary Services Engineers be ascertained and complied with in this development.
4. That the Factories Act 1955, and Regulations made thereunder be complied with.
5. That the requirements of the Chief Fire Officer be ascertained and strictly adhered to in the development.
6. That a financial contribution in the sum of £400 (four hundred pounds) be paid by the proposer to the Dublin County Council towards the cost of provision of public services in the area of the proposed development, and which facilitates this development; this contribution to be paid before the commencement of development on the site.
7. That the development comply with the control of Atmospheric Pollution Regulations 1970.
