APPLICANT: More O'Ferrall Limited

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/996/76 dated 6th April, 1976 decide to refuse:

~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ PERMISSION; ~~APPROVAL~~

for Retention of advertising structures at Tymon Lane, Tallaght Road

for the following reasons:

1. The development, if retained, would materially contravene the policy of the County Council in respect of advertising structures, as expressed in Paragraph 2.32 of the County Development Plan.
2. The retention of the advertising hoardings would, by reason of their location, purpose and size, constitute a serious distraction to road users and, as such, would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard.
3. The retention of the advertising hoardings would, by reason of size and location, obscure and dwarf the normal statutory road warning and road directional signs and, as such, would frustrate and render nugatory the purpose and desired safety effects of the statutory road signs.
4. The site of the advertising hoardings is likely to be affected by a proposed motorway interchange.
5. The retention of the proposed hoardings, would, by virtue of prominence and size and the nature of structural support, be seriously injurious to the visual amenity of the area.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and should be addressed to the Secretary, (Planning Appeals Section), Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
