3. That the water supply and drainage arrangements, including the disposal of surface water, be in accordance with the requirements of the County Council.	3. In order to comply with the Sanitary Services Acts, 1878 - 1964.
That the proposed access arrangements and any revisions thereto are to be in accordance with the requirements of the County Council. The applicant must consult with the Roads Engineer with regard to exact details which should provide for adequate vision line and vehicular circulation within the school site.	4. To prevent traffic hazard and in the interest of the proper planning and development of the area.
5. That an adequate and satisfactory landscaping scheme, boundary treatment and programme for such works be submitted to and approved by the County Council.	5. In the interest of amenity.
6. That all necessary measures be taken by the contractor to prevent the spillage or deposit of clay, rubble, or other debris on adjoining roads during the course of the work.	6. To protect the amenities of the area.
