APPLICANT: Mills & Allen Ltd.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/3803/75 dated 1st December 1975 decide to refuse:

~~OUTLINE PERMISSION;~~ PERMISSION; ~~APPROVAL~~

for Proposed modification of advertising sign at Fox & Geese,
Naas Road.

for the following reasons:

- (1) The proposed structures by reason of their size location and obtrusive appearance and immediately adjoining the Naas Road dual carriageway would not be in accordance with the proper planning and development of the area and would seriously injure the amenity of the area.
- (2) The proposed structures by reason of their size location and obtrusive appearance would be likely to endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard because of their effect in attracting the attention of road users on this heavily trafficked National Primary Route.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and should be addressed to the Secretary, (Planning Appeals Section), Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
