APPLICANT: ~~XXXX~~ Irish Biscuits Ltd.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/83/75 dated 13th January, 1975, decide to refuse:

~~OUTLINE PERMISSION~~ PERMISSION; ~~APPROVAL~~

for Proposed access to distributor road "A" and retention of part perimeter

fencing at Kilnamanagh, Belgard Road, Tallaght.

for the following reasons:

1. The proposed new access arrangements for industrial and commercial traffic to a primarily residential road would be likely to create a serious traffic hazard by reason of the additional commercial and industrial vehicle movements to and from the industrial site on this primarily residential road and also at the proposed junction points to both Belgard Road and Greenhills Road.

Note: There is not an objection to the proposed fencing arrangements for a temporary period pending agreement with the Planning Authority with regard to the permanent boundary treatment and landscaping required on completion of the Distributor Road connecting Greenhills Road to the Belgard Road Improvement Scheme. The possibility of an access through Broomhill Road should be explored.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and should be addressed to the Secretary, (Planning Appeals Section), Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
