2. That the applicant makes satisfactory arrangements for the maintenance, repair and upkeep of the structure.	2. In the interests of pedestrian safety and amenity.
3. That the applicant accepts responsibility for the removal of the structure, at his own expense, if such is necessary, for the purpose of road widening, reconstruction or repair, and for the repair, replacement and renewal of any services installed in the public street.	3. In the interest of the proper planning and development of the area.
4. That the lighting of the panels be so controlled as not to cause excessive glare, distraction to road users, or adjoining property owners, and that the hours of lighting shall not extend beyond the normal hours of lighting on the adjoining street lights.	4. In the interests of public safety and amenity.
5. That the applicants indemnify the County Council against any claim made against the Authority as a result of the presence of the structure on public property.	5. In the interests of the proper planning and development of the area.

If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the PERMISSION/APPROVAL after the withdrawal.

An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister for Local Government. The Applicant may appeal within one month from the date of receipt by him of this notification. ANY OTHER PERSON may appeal within twenty-one days beginning on the date of the decision.

An appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter and grounds of the appeal.
