APPLICANT: Woodrow Packaging Ltd.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/67/75 dated 10th January, 1975, decide to refuse:

OUTLINE PERMISSION; ~~PERMISSION~~ APPROVAL.

for Proposed factory extension for storage purposes at Whitechurch Road, Rathfarnham,

for the following reasons:

- (1) The site proposed is located in an area zoned - to preserve and improve residential amenity and to provide for residential development - in the Development Plan. The commercial development proposed would contravene materially these objectives, would not be in accordance with the proper planning and development of the area and would seriously injure the amenities of the area.
- (2) The proposed commercial development which envisages a considerable increase in vehicular traffic movements to and from the site on the inadequate existing road network would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard because of the additional vehicular movements to and from the site.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and should be addressed to the Secretary, (Planning Appeals Section), Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
