

for the following reasons:

1. The proposed development which provides for the construction of an additional dwellinghouse within the curtilage of the existing newly constructed semi-detached dwellinghouse, would be in conflict with the previously approved estate development layout and would not be in accordance with the proper planning and development of the area and would be seriously injurious to the amenities of the existing newly constructed residential properties.

The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and should be addressed to the Secretary, (Planning Appeals Section), Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
