In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order D/2317/70 dated 5/11/70 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act refusing permission for:

Proposed sewerage treatment and disposal works at Tallaght.

for the following reasons:-

1. The proposed development which provides for a large extension to an existing sewerage treatment plant, which is not in the County Council's charge, would not be in accordance with the proper planning and development of the area, by reason of its proximity to the adjoining residential properties and would be seriously injurious to the amenities of the area.

The applicant is advised to consult with the Planning Department, before submitting further plans for approval.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, (Planning Appeals Section), Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
