In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order <u>P/2173/70</u> dated <u>23/10/70</u> make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act refusing permission for:

Proposed 264 houses at Scholarstown Road, Ballyboden.

for the following reasons:-

- 1. There are no public piped sewerage facilities available to serve the proposal.
 - 2. The proposed development would be premature by reason of the said existing deficiency in the provision of severage facilities and the period within which such deficiency may reasonably be expected to be made good.
 - 3. The site is seriously affected by the Council's proposed southern cross route which traverses the site from east to west.
 - 4. The proposal is premature and a road layout for the area has not been indicated in the Development Plan or has not been approved by the Planning Authority.

Note: The applicant is advised to consult with the Sanitary Services Department and the Planning Department with regard to the disposal of surface water and the proposed road layout before submitting further plans for approval.
