The major portion of the site proposed for commercial development for the following reasons:lies in an area which is likely to be included in the Council's Development Plan proposals under the heading "to preserve open space amenity". The development proposed by the applicant would be in sonflict with the Council's Policy and such would not be in accordance with the proper planning and development of the area and would be seriously injurious to the amenities of the area.

There are no public piped sewerage facilities available to serve
