That details of the design and construction of the proposed surface water disposal system shall be in accordance with the Engineering requirements of Dublin County Council.  3. If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, OUTLINE PERMISSION will be gran by the Council as soon as may be after the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the OUTLINE PERMISSION after the withdrawal.

An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister for Local Government. The APPLICANT may appeal within one month from the date of receipt by him of this notification. Any other person may appeal within twent one days beginning on the date of the decision.

An appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter and grounds of appeal. It should be addressed to:

An appeal by the applicant for Outline Permission should be accompanied by this form.

It should be noted that an Outline Permission is a permission subject to the subsequent approval of the Plannian Authority and that, until such approval has been obtained to detailed plans of the development proposed, development is not authorised.
