In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order *P/162/70* dated 30th January, 1970 decide to refuse:  
OUTLINE PERMISSION; ~~PERMISSION~~ ~~APPROVAL~~

for Proposed change of use from Agricultural to Industrial at "New Light",

*St. Margaret's*  
for the following reasons:

1. The proposed industrial use would create a focus for employment and activity, and the consequent generation of noise and traffic would be inconsistent with the rural environment of the area, seriously injurious to its amenities and contrary to its proper planning and development.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and should be addressed to the Secretary, (Planning Appeals Section), Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
