**Reasons for Conditions**

1. that the development be carried out and completed strictly in accordance with the plans and specification lodged with the application, save as is in the conditions hereunder otherwise required.
2. That a financial contribution in the sum of £644 (Eight hundred and forty-four Pounds) be paid by the proposers to the Dublin County Council towards the cost of provision of public services in the area of the proposed development and which facilitate this development; this contribution to be paid before the commencement of development on the site.
3. That the water supply and drainage arrangements shall be in accordance with the requirements of Dublin County Council and where applicable, Dublin Corporation.
4. That the requirements of the Council's Fire Prevention Officer be adhered to in the proposed development.
5. That not less than 10ft. clear circulation be provided between the proposed building to boundary at the southern corner of the site.
6. That not less than 2 No. pedestrian points be provided for along the front of the site between the two vehicular entrances, and shall be submitted to and approved by the County Council.
7. Full details of any proposed area lighting be submitted to and approved by the Council.
8. That the existing mature trees and landscape features shall be retained as far as possible in the proposed development and that detailed programme for any additional landscaping features shall be submitted to and approved by the County Council.

1. To ensure that the development shall be in accordance with the permission and effective control maintained.
2. In the interests of the proper planning and development of the area.
3. In order to comply with Sanitary Services Acts, 1878 - 1964.
4. In the interests of public safety and the avoidance of fire hazard.
