APPLICANT: Roadstonw.Limited.

In pursurance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order **P/73/70.** dated **16th January, 1970** decide to refuse:
~~OUTLINE PERMISSION~~ PERMISSION; ~~AMENDED~~

for Proposed Subway and ancillary Roadworks at Bedleshill, Naas Road.

for the following reasons:

- (1) The proposal shows encroachment on property acquired by Dublin County Council for the purpose of implementing the T.5. Improvement Scheme.
- (2) The proposal does not cater for the Right turning movement for traffic from Naas to the site.
- (3) It is not the intention of the Co. Council to allow slip road access from the Old Naas Road to the Dublin bound carriageway as indicated in the layout of Junction 'B'.
- (4) The proposed layout of the Boot Road junction is undesirable and would constitute a traffic hazard.
- (5) It is not indicated on the plan how the merge between the underpass and the slip road is effected on the carriageway to Dublin side.
- (6) No indication is given as to how the sub-soil and surface water drainage for the Naas Road, which at this point is 5ft. approximately below the level of the carriageway will be dealt with.
- (7) Satisfactory details of the treatment of Surface water drainage in the underpass have not been supplied.
- (8) Details of construction of speed change lanes have not been submitted.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and should be addressed to the Secretary, (Planning Appeals Section), Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
