In pursuance of its functions under the above-mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by Order dated as above make a decision to grant Permission/Approval for

Proposed office and store at Bluebell, Nass Road.

SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS

Conditions

Reasons for Conditions

(1) That the conditions imposed by Order P/1732/69, dated 3rd October, 1969, whereby permission for the development works for the estate was granted, be adhered to in respect of this application (Copy attached).

(1) In the interests of the proper planning and development of the area.

(2) That the proposed development shall be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application, save as is in the conditions hereunder otherwise required.

(2) To ensure that the development shall be in accordance with the permission and effective control maintained.

(3) That the buildings be set back not less than 50-ft from the road boundary.

(3) To prevent unauthorised development.

(4) That the location and alignment of the link road connecting John F. Kennedy Drive to the Dublin Corporation Estate to the north be set out on site and agreed with the Corporation and County Council Roads Department before any development works commence on the site.

(4) In the interests of the proper planning and development of the area.

(5) That Building Bye-Laws Approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.

(5) In the order to comply with Sanitary Services Acts, 1878 - 1964.

(6) No boundary fence obstructing traffic visibility for a height of 3' 6" be erected along the boundary of the road.

(6) In the interests of public safety.

(7) The area between the building line and the road boundary may not be used for storage of machinery, plant and materials.

(7) In the interests of public safety.

(8) Details of the landscape treatment of the area between the building line and the road boundaries must be submitted for approval. Some carparking may be included.

(8) In the interests of the proper planning and development of the area.
