- That Building Bye-Laws Approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.

- (2) In the interestrof visual amenity.
- To prevent unauthorised (3) development.
- In order to comply with Sanitary Services Acts, 1878 -1964.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.
