In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order **P/1108/69** dated **11th July, 1969,** make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant **Permission** ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ for:

**Proposed Retention of Garage at 37, St. Brendan's Crescent,**

**Walkinstown.**

**Floor area: 350 sq.ft.**

subject to the following conditions:-

Conditions:	Reasons for conditions:
(1) That the external finish shall harmonise in colour and texture with the existing dwellinghouse.	(1) In the interest of visual amenity.
(2) That the garage shall not be used for any purpose other than a purpose incidental to the enjoyment of the dwellinghouse as such.	(2) In the interest of amenity and the proper Planning and Development of the area.
(3) That Building Bye-Laws Approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.	(3) In order to comply with Sanitary Services Acts, 1878 - 1964.

If there is ~~Permission~~ **Permission** to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, approval ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the ~~Permission~~ **Permission** as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn, the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ **Permission** as if it had been made to him in the first instance.

APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL UNDER BUILDING BYE LAWS MUST BE OBTAINED BEFORE THE DEVELOPMENT IS COMMENCED AND THE TERMS OF APPROVAL MUST BE COMPLIED WITH IN THE CARRYING OUT OF THE WORK.
