In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/994/69. dated 20th June, 1969 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant an outline permission for:

Proposed temporary factory extension at 9th Lock Road,

Clondalkin.

Floor area:

2,730 sq.ft.

subject to the following conditions.

Condition:

(1) That no constructional work be put in hands until detailed drawings have been submitted to and approved by the County Council under the Local Government (Planning and Development) Act, 1963.

(2) That the structure shall be removed on or before the let July, 1970, unless before that date permission for its retention is granted by the Planning Authority or by the Minister, on appeal. (3) That the requirements of the Council's Fire Prevention Officer regarding the location of the pro-

posed office at a minimum distance of 20' from the permanent buildings, shell be strictly adhered to in the development.

Reason for condition:

(1) In order to comply with the provisions of the Local Government (Planning and Development) Act, 1963.

- (2) To enable the effect of the development on the amenities of the area to be reviewed having regard to the conditions then obtaineng.
- (3) In the interests of public safety and avoidance of fire hazard.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Lucal Government against this decision, outline permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the outline permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn, the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for outline permission as if it has been made to him in the first instance.
