With reference to your letter dated lith March, 1969, regarding planning permission in connection with the above, I am to inform you that before the application can be considered under the Local Government (Planning and Development) Act, 1963, the following information must be submitted in triplicate:-

(1) The curtillage of the applicant's proposed holding has not been clearly indicated and cutlined in red.

(2) The proposed water supply and drainage arrangements to serve the proposal, particularly the design and location of the proposed septic tank.

The proposed vehicle access from the public road.
 The proposed area to be sterilized, particularly the sterilization proposed along the road frontage.

(5) The proposed location of the dwelling on a proper site map.

FOTE: You are advised to consult with the Health Authority, 6, Parnell Square, in regard to the feasibility of draining this site by means of septic tank drainage and should comply with their requirements as to the procurement of trial hole results to this end, if required, before submitting the additional information required. The area and location of land to be sterilized, if any, should also comply with the requirements of the Health Authority.
