In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin
County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District
of Dublin, did by order P/1314/69 dated 8th August, 1969 make a
decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant an outline permission
for: Proposed dwellinghouse at Commons Road, Clondalkin.

Floor area: 1.404 sq.ft.

Conditions:

- (1) That no constructional work be put in
hands until details of the proposed water
supply and drainage connections have been
submitted to and approved by the County
Council. (The applicants must consult with
the Sanitary Services Section, No. 4 Parnell
Square, in this regard).
- (2) That the proposed dwellinghouse be
adequately set back from the highway boundary
(the applicants must consult with the Council's
Road Design Section, No. 6 Parnell Square,
in this regard).

Reasons for conditions:

- (1) In order to provide
for the proper
planning and develop-
ment of the area.
- (2) In order to provide
for the proper planning

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this
decision, outline permission will be granted by the Council on the expira-
tion of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in
accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the
outline permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of
this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the
date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the
subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the
appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to
the Secretary, Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1.
When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn, the Minister
for Local Government will determine the application for outline permission
as if it has been made to him in the first instance.
