APPLICANT C. Bittorly.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/1714/69 dated 3rd October, 1969. make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act refusing permission for:

Proposed extension to store at South Shore, Rush.

Floor area: 750 sq. ft.
for the following reasons:-

- (1) The present and proposed premises cannot be considered suitable for the food business already being carried on by the proposers (i.e. floor and wall surfaces are unsatisfactory, the utensil washing facilities proposed will be insufficient). The drainage arrangements are totally unacceptable the septic tank being located just outside the western wall of the existing premises.
- (2) The appropriate requirements of the Food Hygiene Regulations apply in this instance; they are not being observed at present and an unregistered food business is in operation.

NOTE: Further urgent consultations with the Chief Medical Officer's Department are required.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, (Planning Appeals Section), Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
