(1) The site lies in a rural area, where public piped sewerage services are not available and in which the proposel would constitute serious injury to the existing rural environment and emenity which it is the Council's general policy to preserve and maintain, as provided for in the Draft Development Plan.

(2) The proposal, if implemented, would constitute a serious traffic hazard on the heavily traffiched Dublin/Uroghed Bounk Road (T.I.) due to extra traffic turning movements which would be generated, thereby interfering with the free flow of traffic on T.L. and reducing its capacity to carry heavy traffic at fast appeds.

(3) The site lies within the approach area to a proposed future runway at Dublin Airport and would be within 9,600 so. of the rurway threshold. The proposal therefore would endanger public safety.
