In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/536/69 dated 17th April, 1969. make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

Proposed factory at Ballyfermot Industrial Estate.

subject to the following conditions:-

Condition:	Reason for condition:
(1) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application save as is in the conditions hereunder otherwise required.	(1) To ensure that the development shall be in accordance with the permission and effective control maintained.
(2) That details of the proposed front boundary walls, railings and gates be submitted to and approved by the County Council before any constructional work takes place; these details should include the entire length of frontage to the site and also for the extension of these walls and railings along the east and west flanks for a length of not less than 30-ft. or to the proposed secondary gates at the west flank of the proposed structure.	(2) In the interests of the proper planning and development of the area.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.
