NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one menth from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appealant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Derartment of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Gustom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.

Approval of the council under Building Bye Laws must be obtained and the terms of the approval must be complied with in the carrying out of the work before any development which may be permitted is commenced.
