NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appealant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Decartment of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin 1.
