In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order **P/652/69** dated **12th May, 1969.** make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant an approval for: **Permission for:-**
Proposed Dwelling at the Cross, Rush.

<p>(1) That the development be carried out and completed strictly in accordance with the plans and specification lodged with the application.</p> <p>(2) That a screen wall not less than 6ft. high, properly rendered and capped, be erected along the north west edge of the site curtilage.</p> <p>(3) That Building Bye-Laws Approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.</p>	<p>(1) To ensure that the development shall be in accordance with the permission and effective control maintained.</p> <p>(2) To protect the privacy and amenity of the proposed dwelling.</p> <p>(3) In order to comply with Sanitary Services Acts, 1878 - 1964.</p>

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, ~~Permission~~ **Permission** will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the ~~Permission~~ **Permission** as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for approval as if it had been made to him in the first instance.

APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL UNDER BUILDING BYE LAWS MUST BE OBTAINED BEFORE THE DEVELOPMENT IS COMMENCED AND THE TERMS OF APPROVAL MUST BE COMPLIED WITH IN THE CARRYING OUT OF THE WORK.
