A PERMISSION/APPROVAL has been granted for the development described below subject to the mentioned conditions.

**Proposed construction of factory, offices and warehouse building at Cloushaugh Industrial Estate, Coolock.**

**CONDITIONS**

10. Run-off from up-liftage areas should be subject to the provisions of the Water Pollution Act, 1977.  
 11. The colour of the metal cladding to be used on the factory walls shall be subject to agreement with the Planning Department prior to commencement of development. The proposals should have reference to the existing finished throughout the estate.  
 12. A turning bay to Roads Department's specification to be provided at the end of the Spar Road.  
 13. Radii of kerbs at entrance to site should be a minimum of 35ft.  
 14. That a block plan scale 1:500 be submitted before development commences indicating the following:-  
 a. Proposed site boundary treatment, including hedgerows to be retained.  
 b. Proposed landscaping plan for site including treatment of areas identified for possible future expansion.
