1. The applicants have not satisfied the Chief Medical Officer that they are in a position to comply with the required standards in relation to lead pollution. The Planning Authority is not satisfied that the smoke emissions from the chimney are not prejudicial to public health.

When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn, An Bord Pleanala will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to them in the first instance.

Dear Sir,

With reference to your planning application received here on 4th June, 1982 in connection with the above, I wish to inform you, that before the application can be considered under the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, the following additional information must be submitted in quadruplicate:-

1. The pollution resulting from the operation of the chimney stack is unacceptable to the Supervising Health Inspector on a number of grounds viz:-
  - (1) The lead levels in the air measured at Fischer metals averaged  $7.8 \mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$  for the period 27.5.82-30.6.82 (24 days). The EEC standard for lead in air is  $2 \mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$  annual mean.
  - (2) The acidity of the exhaust gases is excessive.
  - (3) There has been an increase of 64% registered at the smoke and  $\text{SO}_2$  station at Monastery Road, Clondalkin over the period 1980-82 and it would appear that the chimney might be contributing greatly to this increase.

The applicants should indicate if they are in a position to take steps to rectify the above matters.
