NOTIFICATION OF A DECISION ON AN APPLICATION FOR A PERMISSION

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District Dublin, did by order P/276/68 dated 27th February, 1968. make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

Proposed Scouts' Hall and toilet facilities adjoining St. Killian's Park, Watery Lane

Floor Area: 1,700 sq. ft.

subject to the following conditions:-

Condition

1. That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application, save as is in the conditions hereunder otherwise required.
2. That the proposed building be not used for night social activities, which could give rise to noise, disturbance, nuisance, or other annoyance, to the adjoining dwellinghouses.
3. That access to the premises be restricted to the existing access to Watery Lane.
4. That the external finish, including the roof, harmonise in colour and texture with the adjoining development.
5. That Building Bye-Laws approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.
6. That the requirements of the Council's Fire Officer be adhered to in the development.

There is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

Reason for Conditions

To ensure that the development shall be in accordance with the permission and effective control maintained.

In the interests of the general amenity of the adjoining dwellinghouses.

In the interests of public safety and avoidance of traffic hazard.
In the interests of visual amenity.

In order to comply with Sanitary Services Acts, 1878-1964.

In the interests of public safety and fire hazard.

2: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.

APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL UNDER BUILDING BYE LAWS MUST BE OBTAINED BEFORE THE DEVELOPMENT IS COMMENCED AND THE TERMS OF APPROVAL MUST BE COMPLIED WITH IN THE CARRYING OUT OF THE WORK.
