With reference to your letter of the 17th July last regarding planning permission in connection with above, I am to inform you that before the application can be considered under the Local Government (Planning & Development) act, 1963 the following information must be submitted:-

- (I) Details of the material of liquid to be stored.
- (2) Details of the method of emptying the tank or the method of disposal of waste.

Note: In view of the overloading of the existing severs the applicant should submit details of the disposal of rain water other than by discharge to the foul water sever.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/1239/67 dated 14th November 1967 decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

## Groun-wood Storage Tank at Clondalkin

subject to the following conditions:-

- (I) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application.
- (2) That Building Bye-Laws Approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in ordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the mission as soon as may be after the withdrawel.

When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
