- (I) That no constructional work taken place until detailed plans have been submitted to and approved by the Council under the Local Government (Planning and Development) Act, 1963.
- (2) That the front building line of the proposed Duellings shall be sited not less than 30-ft from the boundary fence of the County road.
- (3) That details of water supply and drainage disposal shall be in keeping with the requirements of the Dublih Sanitary Authority.
- Note: As there is no water supply available to serve the development from the Dublin County Council, you are advised to investigate the possibility of obtaining a supply from the Kildare County Council, whose functional area closely adjoins the site of the proposal.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, outline permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the outline permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.
