**NOTIFICATION OF A DECISION ON AN APPLICATION FOR A PERMISSION

APPLICANT Very Rev. George Barry, P.P.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order 27th Aug 67 dated 17th August 1967 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

National Sch. at site off Jarry Road, Dublin

subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application, including the proposed pedestrian access from Jarry Road, details of which are subject to the agreement of the Dublin County Council for the provision of such facility by the developer across lands which are in the ownership of the Dublin County Council and the proposed drainage connections from the school buildings to the Council's sewers on Jarry Road, which are shown on the plans creating the Council's property and for which an agreement and easement would be required from the Dublin County Council.
- Note:** This condition means, in effect, that the decision to grant permission is subject to the necessary agreement being made with the Dublin County Council by the developer for the provision by the last mentioned of the pedestrian access and drainage easement.
- (2) That provision be made for on-site car parking space at the rate of one car space per teacher, plus space for two visitors' cars.
- (3) That Building Bye-law approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.

there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

Note: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.

APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL UNDER BUILDING BYE LAWS MUST BE OBTAINED BEFORE THE DEVELOPMENT IS COMMENCED AND THE TERMS OF APPROVAL MUST BE COMPLIED WITH IN THE CARRYING OUT OF THE WORK.
