LOCAL GOVERNMENT (PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT) ACT, 1963.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order B/340/67 dated 9th June, 1967 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act refusing outline permission for:

9 Houses at Carrigeen, Rathcoole.

for the following reasons:-

1. There is no public water supply or sewerage facilities to serve the proposal.
2. The proposed method of drainage does not comply with the Council's requirements in respect of public health.
3. The proposed sites are located above the 500 ft. contour in an area which is anticipated will be included in a special amenity area order under Section 42 of the Local Government (Planning and Development) Act, 1963, where development of the type proposed would not be permitted.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the applicant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for outline permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
