NOTIFICATION OF A DECISION ON AN APPLICATION FOR A PERMISSION
LOCAL GOVERNMENT (PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT) ACT, 1963.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/257/67 dated 19th May 1967 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

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alterations and extensions to Petrol Station/Motor Garage at Templeogue

subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application.
- (2) That Building Bye-Laws approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.
- (3) Alternative means of escape in case of fire, direct to open air, to be provided from new office.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him on the first instance.

APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL UNDER BUILDING BYE LAWS MUST BE OBTAINED BEFORE THE DEVELOPMENT IS COMMENCED AND THE TERMS OF APPROVAL MUST BE COMPLIED WITH IN THE CARRYING OUT OF THE WORK.

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- (6) That the external finish, including the roofs, windows in colour and texture one with another.
- (7) That all of front boundary walls be submitted to and approved by the Council before they are erected.
- (8) That the margins between the road and footpath be well kept and planted with flowering shrubs at 60ft intervals.
(Conditions No. 6 and 8 refer to visual amenity).
- (9) That building bye-law approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.
