In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order L.P./221/67 dated 11th May 1967 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act refusing outline permission for: House at "St. Anne's", Glenasmole,

for the following reasons:-

- (1) The proposed development would be prejudicial to public health on account of the serious hazard to pollution to the Dublin Corporation water supply from the catchment area of the Glenasmole Valley by septic tank effluent.
- (2) The proposed development would seriously injure the natural amenities of the Glenasmole Valley which the Planning Authority proposes to preserve by means of a Special Amenity Area Order.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the applicant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for outline permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
