In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/1671/66 dated 21st Merch 1967 make a ducision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

Pair of Semi-detached Houses on Sites No.351,352, Rosemount Estate, Rathfarnham

subject to the following conditions:-

- (I) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application.
- (2) That no development under any Permission granted pursuant to this decision be commenced until an Insurance Company Bond in the sum of £150 conditioned for the provision and completion of services of footpaths, kerbs, verges and ancillary works for the Permitted development has been lodged with the Council and acknowledged in writing by it.
- (3) That Building Bye-Laws Approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this ducision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.
