In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/42/67 dated 10th April 1967 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

Houses Sites 1 - 14, Fonthill Abbey, Rathfarnham

subject to the following conditions:-

- (I) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application.
- (2) That the houses be set back not less than 30-ft from the improvement line boundary for Ballyboden Road.
- (3) That no trees be removed from the site without the prior approval of the Council's Planning Department.
- (4) That no development under any Permission granted pursuant to this decision be commenced until an Insurance Company Bond in the sum of £600 conditioned for the provision and completion of services of footeness, kerbs and verges for the Permitted development has been ledged with the Council and acknowledged in writing by it.
- (5) That Building Bye-Lews Approval shall be obtained and pay conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision; permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision.
