In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/1423/66 dated 26th Jan.1967 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act refusing permission for:

Porch to house at Wainsfort Avenue, Teronure

for the following reasons :-

- (I) The proposed porch would project approximately 5st.6-ins. in front of the front wall of houses Nos.5 and 7 and thereby infringe the building line established by this pair of houses.
- (2) The proposed porch would cause serious injury to the amenity of the adjaining house i.e. No.5.
- Note: Now are informed that a further application for permission to erect a suitably designed porch which would project not more than 3-ft in front of the existing house, would receive consideration.
