NOTIFICATION OF A DECISION REFUSING OUTLINE PERMISSION
LOCAL GOVERNMENT (PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT) ACT, 1963.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/1134/66 dated 22nd Nov., 1966 make a decision pursuant to Section 26 (1) of the Act refusing outline permission for: Lock-up shop at Lucan for

for the following reasons:-

- (1) The site is most inadequate in regard to public road frontage, absence of off-street car parking space on the site and location (on a Trunk Road - T.3.) to contain the proposal satisfactorily.
- (2) The proposal would be seriously injurious to the amenity of an adjoining dwelling to which the site is a secondary means of access and also to the amenity of other dwellings in the immediate vicinity.
- (3) The kind of shop proposed, i.e. user, is not indicated in the application.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the applicant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin. 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for outline permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
