LOCAL GOVERNMENT (PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT) ACT, 1963.TO Anthony Corcoran, Esq.,Reference No. in Planning Register of

APPLICANT

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/1063/66 dated 8th Nov., 1966 make a decision pursuant to Section 26 (1) of the Act refusing outline permission for:

Dwelling house at Friarstown, Tallaght

for the following reasons:-

- (1) The site lies between the 600' and 700' contour and is in an area which is likely to be recommended for inclusion in the Development Plan as Mountain Reservation zone and an area of special amenity which the erection of buildings is prohibited except in certain cases.
- (2) Piped sewerage facilities are not available to serve the proposal.
- (3) The areas of land proposed for sterilisation in connection with the proposal are unsatisfactory in that they are not contiguous.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the applicant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section) Custom House, Dublin. 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for outline permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
