NOTIFICATION OF A DECISION ON AN APPLICATION FOR A PERMISSION

APPLICANT Michael McCathy

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/998/66 dated 21st October, 1966 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

Dwelling on Site No. 288, Rosemount Estate, Rathfarnham.

subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) That cognizance be taken of the conditions attached to the previous permission for development of the sites of the proposal, under Order No. TP/2907/65, dated 24th February, 1966, in so far as they affect the proposed development.
- (2) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application.
- (3) That the radius of the traffic kerb at the junction adjoining site No. 288 be not less than 35' and that of the front boundary wall not less than 50'. (In the interests of public safety).

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.

APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL UNDER BUILDING BYE LAWS MUST BE OBTAINED BEFORE THE DEVELOPMENT IS COMMENCED AND THE TERMS OF APPROVAL MUST BE COMPLIED WITH IN THE CARRYING OUT OF THE WORK.
